The Gawcott Mile for Alec's Angels 2024



Saturday 27th April, 10.30 am

This year the **Gawcott Mile** will take place on Saturday 27th April, registration from 10.30 am. Runs start at 11.00 am. It is a one-mile Fun Run from the Methodist Chapel, through the village and up the Hillesden Road to the Pavilion in the Richard Roper playing field. The participants will run around the Pavilion before running back down Hillesden Road, back into the village and then up Church Street, down past the Church and back to the Chapel.

There is a £5 entry fee (although additional donations are very welcome) which goes to the charity. This can be payable on the day or via the Alec's Angels 'Just Giving Page' just put your name and Gawcott Mile 2024.

Every runner wins a splendid medal. There are trophies for the fastest adult male and female runners, fastest boy and girl under the age of 14, and the 'Roundwood Cup' is presented to the fastest runner who attends Roundwood School, where Alec' was once a pupil. There will also be a 'Mini Marathon' for small children, a short run from the Chapel to the village school to claim their medal and prizes.

Alec was a cheeky, fun-loving little boy, even when he was really ill, he wanted to make those around him happy. He asked his parents to do something for the other poorly children "even if it is only to make them smile". The Alec's Angels charity does that, supporting terminally ill children and their families, creating special memories, and making them smile. Alec's favourite colours were orange and lime green.

This year our fancy dress challenge for the 'Goodman Cup' will be 'wear it orange' – anything goes – if there is some orange involved – see how creative you can be. As well as this there will be a raffle and a few other stalls in the Chapel, as well as refreshments.

If anyone would like to help in any way (extra marshals for the route are always useful, people to run a stall or help with the refreshments are also welcome) please let me know.

Donations of raffle or tombola prizes, or cakes would be gratefully received.

I look forward to seeing as many of you there as possible.

News from Gawcott with Lenborough Parish Council

The Parish Council meets monthly at the Village Hall. Dates of meetings are on our website www.gawcottwithlenboroughpc.co.uk. All are welcome to attend.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Thursday 18th April at 7pm followed by the Parish Council meeting and all are welcome.

Planning:

The latest planning applications received that are being considered by Buckinghamshire Council are as follows:

24/00131/APP – Change of use of land to a gypsy and traveller caravan site and erection of day room – Land to the West of Main Street South, Gawcott

24/00485/APP – Householder application for first floor extension to garage and convert to annexe including associated works – Gawcott Farm, Lenborough Road, Gawcott

24/00498/VRC – Removal of condition 5 (unit to be demolished) relating to application 23/02485/APP (redevelopment of existing barn complex to form 1 No. residential dwelling (retrospective) – Rowan Tree Farm, Hillesden Road, Gawcott

24/00731/APP - Change of use from equestrian to a mixed use of equestrian, business and residential use. Demolition of existing equestrian buildings and the erection of single storey stables, storage barn, office and dwelling house – Hollow Farm, Buckingham Road, Gawcott

Other news:

- The Pavilion Our funding application was successful. The showers and the kitchen will be prioritised for refurbishment and then from May 2024, other improvements will be completed. Thank you to Buckinghamshire Council Community Boards for the funding which will help pay for the improvements.
- Streetlights We are aware some are still not working. However, Buckinghamshire Council advise that they await parts for some in order to repair them.

Wanted: Caretaker / Handy Person for Gawcott with Lenborough Parish Council

Gawcott with Lenborough Parish Council is seeking a Caretaker / Handy Person to look after it's land and buildings. The position would probably suit someone who is reasonably local to the parish, and who has a demonstrable ability to carry out general DIY tasks to a good standard. We don't anticipate that the successful person is a trade specialist, but all trade backgrounds or even keen DIY hobbyists can work for us.

Examples of work required include general fixing, maintenance work and groundworks. We would anticipate bringing in specialists for things like electrical work and plumbing as the need arises. Providing access to the pavilion and all- weather pitch when required and ensuring secure after use.

Whilst it's difficult to estimate the time commitment for this role, we anticipate an initial need of 5 hours per month, working flexibly. The role will be remunerated at £15 per hour.


