Planning:

The latest planning applications that are being considered by Buckinghamshire Council are as follows: **24/01276/APP** - Householder application for demolition of conservatory, extension and alteration to existing house and single storey enclosure to existing pool - The Laurels, Lenborough Road, Gawcott

The Pavilion – It is hoped that the work will be finished by the end of May.

Wanted: Caretaker / Handy Person for Gawcott with Lenborough Parish Council

Gawcott with Lenborough Parish Council is seeking a Caretaker / Handy Person to look after it's land and buildings. The position would probably suit someone who is reasonably local to the parish, and who has a demonstrable ability to carry out general DIY tasks to a good standard. We don't anticipate that the successful person is a trade specialist, but all trade backgrounds or even keen DIY hobbyists can work for us.

Examples of work required include general fixing, maintenance work and groundworks. We would anticipate bringing in specialists for things like electrical work and plumbing as the need arises. Providing access to the pavilion and all- weather pitch when required and ensuring secure after use.

Whilst it's difficult to estimate the time commitment for this role, we anticipate an initial need of 5 hours per month, working flexibly. The role will be remunerated at £15 per hour.


